1.0 Executive Summary

In accordance with the Risk-Based Audit and Evaluation Plan of MLK PG College for 2015-16, the Audit and Evaluation Branch conducted Administrative audit of the college in September 2015.

The purpose of the audit was to ensure that the practices followed in the campus are in accordance with the Administrative Policy adopted by the institution. With this in mind, the specific objectives of the audit were to evaluate the adequacy of the management control framework as well as the degree to which the Departments are in compliance with the applicable regulations, policies and standards.

During the initial planning of the audit, an analysis was conducted on the methodologies of the administrative policies. The analysis was based upon an examination of the policies, manuals and standards on data analysis, and on the results of preliminary interviews with personnel considered key in the Administrative management in the campus. The criteria and methods used in the audit were based on the identified risks.

The methodology used included physical inspection of the campus, review of the relevant documentation, and interviews.

2.0 Statement of Assurance

This audit has been conducted in accordance with the International Standards for the Professional Practice of Internal Auditing

In our professional judgment, sufficient and appropriate audit procedures were completed and evidence gathered to support the accuracy of the conclusions reached and contained in this report. The conclusions are based on a comparison of the situations as they existed at the time of the audit with the established criteria.

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3.0 Summary of Findings

The main findings of the audit show that, in general, all the departments are aware about the need for Administrative policies at a general level. However, on detailed review, it was observed that, though the college is implementing the Administrative Policy, many of the practices followed in the institution are not in compliance with the Administrative Policy of the institution, and the applicable standards. In addition, certain processes could benefit from further review in order to improve their efficiency, fairness and consistency.

- Hostel accommodation should be provided to more girl students.

In accordance with the Risk-Based Audit and Evaluation Plan of MLK PG College for 2018-19, the Audit and Evaluation Branch conducted Academic and Administrative audit of the college in April 2019.

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3.0 Summary of Findings

The main findings of the audit show that, in general, all the departments are aware about the need for Academic and Administrative policies at a general level. However, on detailed review, it was observed that, though the college is implementing the Academic and Administrative Policy, many of the practices followed in the institution are in compliance with the academic and Administrative Policy of the institution, University and State Government. In addition, certain processes could benefit from further review in order to improve their efficiency, fairness and consistency.

M.L.K.P.G.College is a premier college of Siddharth University, Kapilvastu, Siddharth 4.0 About the college Nagar and is approved under section 2(f) and 12(b) of the University Grants Commission. This institution has attracted the attention of Indo-Nepal educational fraternity towards its recognition as the biggest educational institution in Terai region of Eastern Uttar Pradesh in quality and quantity parameters. Therefore, it is called as Oxford of Terai. From the very beginning, Balrampur Estate has laid its emphasis on education for the downtrodden and the poor that really form the major bulk of the society. Therefore, after independence Rajarshi Late Maharaja Sir Pateshwari Prasad Singh, who had an incisive understanding of the social evils of poverty, established this college on 15th July, 1955. The college campus is spread over an area of 28.36 acres having 07 lush green beautiful lawns with so many rare plants. It provides quality based education at undergraduate and postgraduate level in different streams of Arts, Science, Commerce and B.Ed.

The college runs 14 U.G., 10 P.G. and 22 different Short Term/Value Added and Skill-Based Courses. The college is also an important research Centre of Siddharth University providing research facility through 25 faculty members in 11 disciplines. 24 faculties are representing the Board of Studies of Siddharth University, kapilvastu, Siddharth Nagar as convenor/member.
