IQAC of MLK PG College ensured the implementation of quality assurance and guidelines for the institution. With the association of all the stakeholders IQAC managed to establish an apparatus to coordinate the administrative and academic domains of the college. IQAC maintained a rich research culture in the institution. To enhance its capabilities and address challenges in organizing students' progress and placement data, there was a subsequent plan to compile comprehensive details of all activities undertaken by our students post enrolment this session.

The Teaching Learning programme at our institution is dedicated to fostering the holistic development of our students, both personally and intellectually, by encouraging interdisciplinary learning and addressing academic gaps. An orientation program was conducted aimed at introducing first-year students to the offerings of the M.L.K P.G. College Balrampur. Annual Quality Assurance Report of M.L.K P.G. College Balrampur Teaching Program, is designed to enhance teaching and learning experiences for undergraduates across various disciplines. This program facilitates personalized one-to-one connections between student mentors and mentees, focusing on nurturing critical thinking, fostering reasoning skills, promoting teamwork, and enriching the cognitive abilities of participating students.

A workshop for the Teaching & Non-teaching staff was organized by the IQAC. College conducted the workshop with an aim to equip the staff with skills to handle the stress and challenges faced by them in the execution of administrative and academic tasks. IQAC ensured participation of all staff members in the workshop.

Academic and Administrative auditing Regular academic and administrative audits are part of our institution's governance and quality assurance measures. On 1st October 2023, an internal audit was conducted for the last academic session, while an external academic audit spanning the took place in the second week of November 2023. These audits play a crucial role in ensuring the effectiveness and efficiency of the teaching-learning processes within all departments. Furthermore, an administrative audit was carried out on December 10th, 2023, focusing on evaluating administrative functions and processes within the institution. These audits are essential to maintaining and enhancing the overall operational efficiency and quality of academic and administrative functions.

Promotion of faculty members Faculty promotions at our institution adhere strictly to the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) set forth by the University. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has been consistently engaged in facilitating faculty promotions, ensuring transparency throughout the process in alignment with the University's SOPs. Classroom teaching is bilingual, however, the faculty members walk the extra mile to help students with various linguistic backgrounds. Traditional knowledge of Vedic Mathematics and science, Indian political thought and statecraft, and Indian culture and languages have been blended into the course modules across all departments. Full equity and inclusion as the cornerstone of all educational decisions to ensure that all students can thrive in the education system. Yoga is taught as an extra-curricular subject. The college has a separate manuscript section in the library which contains rare pieces from various eras of history that provide students with a deeper sense of understanding of our cultural heritage. The curriculum aids their skill growth and reinforces their preparation for future endeavors. The courses are offered as outcome-based education (OBE) which is designed keeping in mind the regional and global requirements. Most teachers at their level, informally keep track of course milestones and ensure that curriculum implementation is done in line with the course objectives. Each course faculty articulates the learning outcomes and outcomes of the program, making the teaching-learning process more fruitful, as students are made aware of the topic's relevance in their pursuit of knowledge.

20.Distance education/online education:

College contributes towards the creation of digital content from

faculty members, and professionals in the form of video lectures in the area of their expertise or any other contemporary topic of general interest to all. Faculty members of the college are encouraged to contribute to digital content creation. This can be considered the new normal, which is envisaged in the New Education Policy as well. The faculty members prepared a strategic combination of both synchronous and asynchronous methods. 1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

The institution has established mechanisms for effective curriculum delivery and documentation. M.L.K. P.G. College implements the curriculum designed by Siddharth University, Kapilvastu, Siddharth Nagar. The academic calendar, timetables,

and modular teaching plans for UG and PG courses are prepared well in advance of each semester. Regular departmental meetings are held to review the efficiency of curriculum delivery, and faculty members are encouraged to adopt innovative teaching-learning methods to enhance the process.

Teachers effectively utilize a range of ICT tools, including PPTs, video lectures, models, charts, and the traditional chalk-and-talk method, to deliver the curriculum. Adequate practical facilities are provided, and departments organize educational tours to offer students practical knowledge of their subjects. To further enrich students' learning experiences, scientists and academicians are invited for guest lectures.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The Mentoring System at MLK PG College, a widely adopted practice, was established with two main objectives: (1) to maintain a student-centric approach, and (2) to provide equitable support to students from diverse academic and socioeconomic backgrounds. This system ensures a comprehensive understanding of each student while addressing the diversity within the student community.

Subject-specific faculty members implement the Continuous Internal Evaluation System (CIES) through periodic assessments, mandatory assignment submissions, and in-class performance evaluations. The CIES, alongside midterm test performance, helps identify and differentiate between slow learners and advanced learners. Based on faculty assessments, students who score below 40% on periodic tests are classified as "Slow Learners." To assist these students in bridging gaps, the college conducts remedial classes. It has been observed that slow learning often arises due to the use of English as the primary language of instruction in the science faculty. In response, the college is offering English language and communication training to address this challenge.

Additionally, the college encourages peer learning, where students collaborate within their peer groups to enhance understanding and learning. Students in the top 25% are classified as Advanced Learners. These students are encouraged to demonstrate their skills through participation in discussions, tests, seminars, and other events. Advanced learners also receive personalized mentoring, including guidance for postgraduate studies. Furthermore, they are motivated to engage in research, co-author academic papers, and are connected with alumni for research assistant roles and internships.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

In addition to the traditional lecture style of instruction, ICT use has significantly expanded across all departments. This has made it possible for the instructor to use audio-visual aids to deliver lessons and display images, diagrams, and PowerPoint presentations. Students also use these tools for their presentations in class. This lessens stage fear and increases their sense of self-worth. The philosophy of "learning by doing" is promoted to students. MLK believes that true understanding, much like experiencing the salt, comes through direct experience. As a result, MLK's teaching-learning process has historically prioritised experiential learning. The college's increasing financial assistance to the relevant department for field trips, workshops and seminars helps to better understand this legacy. The

geography, botany, and zoology department's fieldwork design and implementation have become models for other local colleges. It has become a necessary yearly event in departments including psychology, home science, teacher training, business administration and field trips to the Balrampur Sugar Factory, District Hospital, Government Schools, etc. In order to learn about the socioeconomic standing of the local tribes and to get their knowledge of therapeutic plants and animal byproducts, tours are planned to visit particular areas. This improves their comprehension of theory and the ideas underlying practical applications.

2.3.2 - Teachers use ICT enabled tools for effective teaching-learning process. Write description in maximum of 200 words

The college has achieved yet another milestone in the field of ICT-based teaching and learning with the addition of two new, cutting-edge smart classrooms in the psychology and physics departments. These classrooms are furnished with Epodiums, a sound system, a microphone, a digital white board and Tech Infinity software. A wi-fi campus, a computer lab, a language lab, a partially automated library, and multiple classrooms equipped with projectors and digital boards make up the current ICT. E-contents in form of ppts, tutorial videos, etc. are made available to the students by departments. The library has digitised the catalogues and made other digital materials available to teachers and students for easier access and availability of study materials. A lab with 60 computers and the required software, including MATLAB, Lab VIEW, CST, Chemdraw, R, SPSS, SYSTAT, and others, are available at the computer department. Faculty members often use Google Meet, Google Forms, Google Classrooms, Zoom, and other tools to collect and share information. For students' convenience, a number of instructors have posted their video lectures to YouTube. Additionally, students are encouraged to enroll in self-paced courses through SWAYAM-MOOCs.

At our college, a vermicomposting system transforms solid waste into organic fertilizer, producing vermiwash that shields earthworms from harmful pathogens and boosts plant health. This process helps combat plant pathogens and promotes better photosynthesis. To support waste sorting, blue and green bins are placed throughout campus, with strict rules against littering and plastic bag use.

Liquid waste management ensures the safe disposal of expired liquids and lab chemicals, neutralising them to avoid environmental damage. Soluble waste is stored and buried securely, while a well-maintained drainage system ensures water doesn't stagnate.

E-waste management deals with the complexities of electronic waste. Some materials are repurposed for educational purposes, while the rest is safely discarded. Proper disposal of e-waste is crucial to prevent health risks. Overall, effective waste management is key to maintaining a cleaner, safer environment for everyone.

The Maharaja Sir Bhagwati Prasad Singh All India Prize Money Hockey Tournament, first held in Balrampur in 1938, continues to be a significant cultural event for the town. Founded by Maharaja Sir Pateswari Prasad Singh in memory of his father, Maharaja Sir Bhagwati Prasad Singh, the tournament was a regular fixture until

1963, when legislative changes altered its course. The responsibility for organizing the event then passed to M.L.K. (P.G.) College, Balrampur, which has successfully managed the tournament since 1968. Over the years, the event has been graced by legendary hockey players, including Dhyanchand, K. D. Singh "Babu," and other Olympic athletes. Today, the tournament has grown to national prominence and is recognized with a B grade status by Hockey India. It regularly attracts over 14 national-level teams, showcasing some of the finest talent in Indian hockey. Despite the setbacks caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the tournament resumed in the 2021-2022 session, reaffirming its place as a symbol of Balrampur's deep-rooted love for hockey and its role in advancing the sport on a national scale.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The Mentoring System at MLK PG College, a widely adopted practice, was established with two main objectives: (1) to maintain a student-centric approach, and (2) to provide equitable support to students from diverse academic and socioeconomic backgrounds. This system ensures a comprehensive understanding of each student while addressing the diversity within the student community.

Subject-specific faculty members implement the Continuous Internal Evaluation System (CIES) through periodic assessments, mandatory assignment submissions, and in-class performance evaluations. The CIES, alongside midterm test performance, helps identify and differentiate between slow learners and advanced learners. Based on faculty assessments, students who score below 40% on periodic tests are classified as "Slow Learners." To assist these students in bridging gaps, the college conducts remedial classes. It has been observed that slow learning often arises due to the use of English as the primary language of instruction in the science faculty. In response, the college is offering English language and communication training to address this challenge.

Additionally, the college encourages peer learning, where students collaborate within their peer groups to enhance understanding and learning. Students in the top 25% are classified as Advanced Learners. These students are encouraged to demonstrate their skills through participation in discussions, tests, seminars, and other events. Advanced learners also receive personalized mentoring, including guidance for postgraduate studies. Furthermore, they are motivated to engage in research, co-author academic papers, and are connected with alumni for research assistant roles and internships.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

In addition to the traditional lecture style of instruction, ICT use has significantly expanded across all departments. This has made it possible for the instructor to use audio-visual aids to deliver lessons and display images, diagrams, and PowerPoint presentations. Students also use these tools for their presentations in class. This lessens stage fear and increases their sense of self-worth. The philosophy of "learning by doing" is promoted to students. MLK believes that true understanding, much like experiencing the salt, comes through direct experience. As a result, MLK's teaching-learning process has historically prioritised experiential learning. The college's increasing financial assistance to the relevant department for field trips, workshops and seminars helps to better understand this legacy. The geography, botany, and zoology department's fieldwork design and implementation have become models for other local colleges. It has become a necessary yearly event in departments including psychology, home science, teacher training, business administration and field trips to the Balrampur Sugar Factory, District Hospital, Government Schools, etc. In order to learn about the socioeconomic standing of the local tribes and to get their knowledge of therapeutic plants and animal byproducts, tours are planned to visit particular areas. This improves their comprehension of theory and the ideas underlying practical

applications.

The college has achieved yet another milestone in the field of ICT-based teaching and learning with the addition of two new, cutting-edge smart classrooms in the psychology and physics departments. These classrooms are furnished with Epodiums, a sound system, a microphone, a digital white board and Tech Infinity software. A wi-fi campus, a computer lab, a language lab, a partially automated library, and multiple classrooms equipped with projectors and digital boards make up the current ICT. E-contents in form of ppts, tutorial videos, etc. are made available to the students by departments. The library has digitised the catalogues and made other digital materials available to teachers and students for easier access and availability of study materials. A lab with 60 computers and the required software, including MATLAB, Lab VIEW, CST, Chemdraw, R, SPSS, SYSTAT, and others, are available at the computer department. Faculty members often use Google Meet, Google Forms, Google Classrooms, Zoom, and other tools to collect and share information. For students' convenience, a number of instructors have posted their video lectures to YouTube. Additionally, students are encouraged to enroll in self-paced courses through SWAYAM-MOOCs.

Our continuous internal assessment strategy ensures students receive consistent feedback, allowing them to identify areas for improvement. Various assessment tools are used, including multiple-choice questions, written responses, presentations, and projects, to effectively measure the outcomes of each course.

To maintain transparency, the internal assessment modes and tentative dates are carefully planned in advance by the Examination Cell for each subject. These details are integrated into the academic modules created at the beginning of each semester. The weightage for each assessment activity is clearly communicated to students at the start of the course. Additionally, we provide multiple opportunities for students to improve their performance.

7.1.3 Waste Management

Solid waste management follows the principles of Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle. Biodegradable waste breaks down in oxygen-rich conditions, turning into nutrient-packed compost, while non-biodegradable waste is properly disposed of in designated locations. At our college, a vermicomposting system transforms

solid waste into organic fertilizer, producing vermiwash that shields earthworms from harmful pathogens and boosts plant health. This process helps combat plant pathogens and promotes better photosynthesis. To support waste sorting, blue and green bins are placed throughout campus, with strict rules against littering and plastic bag use.

Liquid waste management ensures the safe disposal of expired liquids and lab chemicals, neutralising them to avoid environmental damage. Soluble waste is stored and buried securely, while a well-maintained drainage system ensures water doesn't stagnate.

E-waste management deals with the complexities of electronic waste. Some materials are repurposed for educational purposes, while the rest is safely discarded. Proper disposal of e-waste is crucial to prevent health risks. Overall, effective waste management is key to maintaining a cleaner, safer environment for everyone.

The Maharaja Sir Bhagwati Prasad Singh All India Prize Money Hockey Tournament, first held in Balrampur in 1938, continues to be a significant cultural event for the town. Founded by Maharaja Sir Pateswari Prasad Singh in memory of his father, Maharaja Sir Bhagwati Prasad Singh, the tournament was a regular fixture until 1963, when legislative changes altered its course. The responsibility for organizing the event then passed to M.L.K. (P.G.) College, Balrampur, which has successfully managed the tournament since 1968. Over the years, the event has been graced by legendary hockey players, including Dhyanchand, K. D. Singh "Babu," and other Olympic athletes. Today, the tournament has grown to national prominence and is recognized with a B grade status by Hockey India. It regularly attracts over 14 national-level teams, showcasing some of the finest talent in Indian hockey. Despite the setbacks caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the tournament resumed in the 2021-2022 session, reaffirming its place as a

symbol of Balrampur's deep-rooted love for hockey and its role in advancing the sport on a national scale.
