7. Summary of the Event : The National Conference On "**Society And Culture During Medieval India (1200-1707 AD)**" commenced on 8th April 2025 at 11:00 AM in the auditorium of **M.L.K. (P.G.) College, Balrampur (U.P.)**. The inaugural session was anchored by Dr. Devendra Chauhan and began with the permission of the seminar's president.

The inaugural session commenced with the ceremonial lighting of lamp, garlanding of Maa Saraswati's picture, Kulgeet of the college and welcome song. Dignitaries on the dais included Prof. J.P. Pandey (Principal), Mr. B.K.Singh (Joint Secretary, Management Committee), Prof. Tabir Kalam (Keynote Speaker), Dr. Mosharraf Ali (Chair Of The Session) Prof. Tabbassum Farkhi, Convener and Ms. Shalini Singh, the organizing secretary.

Shri B.K.Singh, patron of the conference blessed the organizing committee and participants, expressing hope that both online and offline discussions would enlighten students and expand everyone's knowledge. He extended his best wishes for a successful seminar. About the Conference

Medieval India (1200-1707) saw significant transformations in society and culture due to the influence of the Delhi Sultanate (1206-1526) and the Mughal Empire (1526-1707). Society was hierarchical, with a rigid caste system among Hindus and a ruling Muslim elite. Nobles, traders, and artisans formed distinct social groups, while peasants and laborers made up the majority of the population. Persian became the language of administration, and a fusion of Indian and Persian traditions led to the emergence of Indo-Islamic culture.

Art and architecture flourished, with grand structures like the Qutub Minar, Humayun's Tomb, and the Taj Mahal. Bhakti and Sufi movements promoted religious harmony, emphasizing devotion and love for God. Literature thrived in multiple languages, including Sanskrit, Persian, and regional dialects. The Mughal court patronized historians like Abul Fazl. Trade and commerce expanded, connecting India to Central Asia, the Middle East, and Europe.

Festivals, music, and dance reflected a blend of indigenous and foreign influences. Kathak, a classical dance form, evolved during this period. Despite conflicts between different rulers and religious communities, medieval India witnessed cultural synthesis, shaping the diverse heritage of the Indian subcontinent.

Sub Themes:

- + Change in the social structure: Assimilation of new ecclesiastical order and consequent changes in the ruling class, nobility, women's status and slavery.
- + Cultural Exchange and Synthesis: Impact of Islamic conquests and acclimatisation of Muslims in various apparatus of Indian society with special reference to Sufi movement.
- + Religious developments: Extension of Islam in Indian subcontinent and evolution of Hinduism in its influence. Decline of ancient tradition such as Buddhism and Jainism and emergence of new traditions such as Sikhism.
- + Art, Architecture, Literature and History Writing: Influence of Islamic architectural styles and techniques on Indian buildings and development of new temple architecture. Beginning of real history writing and development of corpus of hagiographic and secular literature. New miniature style of painting under Islamic influence.
- + Regional Variations: The complexities of diversity at regional level including the Marathas, Rajputs in Western India, Bengal with its Islamic influence and various Kingdoms of South India.

About the College

The College was established by Late Maharaja Sir Pateshwari Prasad Singh Ji in the year 1955 and is more popularly known as **Oxford of Tarai**. The College is accredited with Grade 'B' by NAAC. The College is situated at a distance of 165 km in the East from Lucknow & 189 km from Gorakhpur. Direct Trains are available to reach Balrampur from any corner of India.
